# GROWTH An opportunity & an obligation

Have you contemplated the extent to which God emphasizes growth? God's Word establishes an expectation that we grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). Jesus' Great Commission communicates that His followers should make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19) to grow His Kingdom. And while we know little about Jesus' childhood, Scripture informs us that *Jesus grew in* wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men (Luke 2:52), as though an awareness of Jesus' growth is all we need to know of those years.

At Shepherds College® (SC), we are choosing to pursue growth, which we simply define as "impacting more lives," specifically the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and those closest to them.

#### THE NEED IS EXTRAORDINARY

Throughout Shepherds' 65-year history, our organization has served an underserved group people with IDD. This group is underserved in the sense that their needs extend well beyond the services that are available to them. For example, a conservative estimate suggests that in the United States, 150,000 students complete high school each year who would be a fit for Shepherds College. Last year, we celebrated our largest recruiting class - 40 first-year students. Approximately 150,000 candidates per year, and we serve 40 of them. Even when you factor in programs similar to SC, this group is profoundly underserved. So, the need to impact more lives is extraordinary.

#### THE PROGRAM IS PROVEN

As Shepherds College completes its 15th year, we have witnessed hundreds of students whose lives have been transformed through the SC experience. Our efforts to help students discover and maximize their God-given potential have proven successful. We have seen students grow in their faith, skills, selfconfidence, self-advocacy, and desire to pursue God's plan for their lives. Our proven model has impacted students' lives in deep and meaningful ways.

## THE VISION IS SHARED

Our organization has a shared sense of the need and obligation to expand the reach of Shepherds College. It is our desire to:

- 1. increase enrollment on our Union Grove campus,
- 2. exponentially raise the number of Shepherds College Online learners (online.shepherdscollege.edu),
- 3. establish SC training programs elsewhere in the country, and
- 4. collaborate with like-missioned organizations to serve individuals with IDD.

This four-pronged vision for expansion is a plan to maximize the impact of Shepherds College across the world.

### THE TIME IS NOW

The time to act on the God-sized vision for the growth and expansion of Shepherds College is now.

This June, we had a team of SC staff, students, and alumni serve God and people with IDD in Brazil as we collaborated with disability ministries in that country.

In July, we took Shepherds College on the road to Texas and Georgia, offering a Shepherds College Preview Experience for individuals with IDD with the goal of establishing an SC training program in both regions in the years ahead.

God is at work in and through Shepherds College, and we are grateful for His provision, protection, and blessing. Therefore, we are compelled to invest our time, energy, and resources to impact more lives. Please join our efforts.

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# LYD/A Growing Into Who I Really Am

Lydia strolled into my office, trying to act nonchalantly, but she could barely contain her energy. It emanated from her in waves, finally bursting from her in a wide, open-mouthed grin. Her slow walk to a chair in the corner of the room couldn't disguise her excitement; trembling hands tightly gripping a piece of paper gave it away as she carefully sat down.

"Do you see anything different about me?" she asked.

I slowly scanned her from head to toe, deliberately overlooking the paper. "Mmmmm... nope! You look normal to me - happy and very smiley."

Lydia tossed her head back and laughed. "I passed my ServSafe test!" She waved the paper in front of her. "I got my certificate! I'm a professional!"

Her joy was infectious. It was a big moment - ServSafe is the leader in food safety training and certification, and the test is challenging - so we celebrated with squeals, clapping, and giggles. Lydia felt successful.

Success wasn't a familiar feeling for Lydia. She struggled with delayed speech and language. She can think of words, but she can't always say them. Lydia put her own words in stories when she was reading aloud. Her parents helped her fill in the blanks at home, but elementary and high school weren't as accommodating.

"I was different than other people," Lydia stated matter-of-factly. "I didn't have good friends in school. People bullied me."

"Why on earth would they bully you?" I interrupted. "Just because you struggle with words?

Lydia cocked her head and stared at me like I should know better. When I didn't answer my own question, she barked out, "LOOK AT ME!" She waited a moment, then jabbed at her right eye. "Look at me."

Lydia had a pronounced lazy eye. "I was in my own world of bullying because of this," she said with resignation. "It made me different. People would pick on me and laugh at me, and teachers did nothing at all. I learned to fight back with my words. I would say, 'God made me this way! I am happy He did!' I would get tired of the bullying, though, and looked forward to breaks so I could get away from people.

"I didn't think I would ever go to college. I was tired of people and how they made fun of me. But one day, I was at a Joni and Friends camp, and my mom talked to another camper's mom. Her son, David, went to Shepherds College, and she told my mom that it was really good for him. So... I did an overnight! It was my first night away from my parents, and I thought it would be hard, but I did great! I came home smiling from ear to ear."

"Do you know what I love the most about Shepherds College?" Lydia asked, leaning forward in her chair, her grin dominating her face. "The people! Isn't that funny? They. Do. Not. Bully. Me. There is no bullying around me!"

Lydia sat back once again, her expression growing serious. "I didn't have good friends until I got to Shepherds. Here, I'm close to everyone. We all understand each other. We know how hard it can be for people who are different." Lydia pressed the fingertips of both hands together, then exploded them outwards in a dramatic show of jazz hands. "We came here, and we were like broken pieces," she slowly drew her fingers inward and intertwined them, "that somehow all fit together to make a wholeness – one great Class of 2023!

"At Shepherds College, I didn't hear 'What's wrong with your eye? You look stupid! Hah, hah!' I only heard what God's purpose was for me. He made me this way. He gave me a speech impediment and a lazy eye. He made me different – there is no one out there exactly like me - for a reason!

"I'm fulfilling my dreams at Shepherds College®. I'm here. I'm safe; no worries. I have people who support me. I love that. I'm so grateful I'm growing into who I really am." Contentment settled over Lydia's expressive face as she clutched her ServSafe certificate of achievement close to her chest.

"I found Shepherds for a reason, and I believe in the dream of 'after Shepherds.' I know there is something out there for me. I'm chasing a dream that *I will catch*."





# Investing in the Future

When spring makes an appearance on the Shepherds College® campus, few things feel more satisfying than soaking up the warm morning sun after a long Wisconsin winter. The birds are cheerfully chirping, and the horticulture staff and students are out in the garden, thrilled to be preparing the soil to plant.

Every so often during this season, winds sweep across the flat farmland with incredible force. In the past, Shepherds College has lost shingles, siding, and hoop house plastic due to these winds.

How do mere humans combat the forces of nature?

## In our horticulture department, we use nature to balance nature.

This past spring, we acquired 75 Norway Spruce through a local tree program—seventy-five little

seedlings with established but bare roots needing to be planted as quickly as possible. One way to complete this enormous task on time was by coming together and working as a team. This massive undertaking was perfect for first-year, second-year, and third-year students to learn from each other. They scouted out the location for the trees and unified to dig holes, mix soil with compost, and re-purpose potting soil before backfilling around the bare roots of each tree.

Once matured, the trees will serve as a windbreak for the garden on the west side of campus and the outlying buildings. Their placement will help to shelter student residential housing, Olson and Glanville Halls, from the afternoon heat of the sun in summer and the arctic winds of winter. The tree line will also capture any drift from nearby farm fields should fertilizer or pesticides be applied, keeping this from affecting students and staff.

When students arrive at Shepherds, many people have already contributed to their journey - parents, relatives, teachers, doctors, IEP teams, therapists, and, possibly, employers. During this special project, all three classes of students worked together to

It was beautiful watching the teams work side by side! The first-year students were like the little saplings we planted, just getting their roots established. The second-year students showed us how quick growth can happen when those roots are nurtured in an ideal environment. Third-year students are well on their way to realizing their potential and maturing.

Norway Pines were chosen for their ability to grow in the type of soil we have on campus. Their branches are resilient and can bear the weight of heavy winter snow without breaking. These trees can grow 2-3 feet a year and begin to provide shelter from the winds within a few short years. They are much like our students who have faced difficult environments, relational challenges, and the weight of disappointment yet continue to stand and see victories for their endurance.

Over the next three years, students will support the trees as they establish strong roots by assisting staff in watering them during dry stretches, keeping the area weeded so they aren't competing for nutrients, and mulching.


Nineteen growing students and five staff worked together to get the pines planted and complete the installation. Their contribution ensured shelter for Shepherds College for many years to come.


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# P A Smiling Success

"His culinary and kitchen skills have grown to the point that he understands the flow of the kitchen and rarely has to be told what needs to be done."

"PJ is someone you can trust. I can leave a task and do something else, knowing he will be doing a good job." Chick-fil-A is a very fast-paced kitchen environment which was overwhelming for PJ initially, but the more confident he grew in this environment, the more his supervisors saw him soar. Jason Miley, the owner/operator, spoke highly of PJ:

"PJ always brought a smile to work that was infectious. I do not state that lightly. If you meet PJ, he can change the dynamic in a room simply with his smile. It is almost like a superpower in that he can take a very stressful environment and defuse it simply with his demeanor and smile. Our team loved working with him and was always excited when scheduled with him. His unique personality and skills will maximize the operations where he works. He is an amazing person and an incredible asset to any team."

"After college, I would like to get a good job," shared PJ.
"I would love to get a front-of-house job because I love greeting and serving people. Some skills I learned at Shepherds College that I would use at a job are knife skills and making salads (and making them look nice!). I would also like to be a prep cook in a commercial kitchen."

Despite the many challenges PJ has faced in his lifetime, he chooses to demonstrate a positive attitude. He attributes his growth and success to Jesus. With his ever-present smile, PJ said, "Jesus has always taken care of me and put the right people along my path."

Justin is my friend, and he has always stood out as unique. As a child among his peers, he was gregarious when they were unsure and funny when they were awkward and self-conscious. Among adults, Justin was comfortable and outgoing, unassuming and vibrant. He was, and is, always an interesting companion, a deep thinker with a vivid imagination, and a thoughtful conversationalist. He made us laugh. He challenged our ideas. His enthusiasm for life and expectation of the good that God was bringing rarely waned. It took a long time to understand the parts of him that weren't quite as obvious.

Justin's parents are professional educators, so they could see what we did not. For all his apparent gifts, certain kinds of cognitive calculation eluded him in ways that would make his family question his ability to live a successful independent life. His parents homeschooled him as far as they could but knew that wouldn't be enough. By the time Justin reached his late teen years, they didn't know what to do next. They knew they had to prepare him for adulthood but didn't know how.

That's when they heard about Shepherds College®. A young man by then, Justin was eager to begin to take hold of his own life, and Shepherds showed him and his family the way. Shepherds showed Justin the next steps at an intentional, measured pace that combined

challenge with empathy and practical training in an effective combination. Like the rest of us, there were some things Justin would never be good at, but the instructors at Shepherds College spotted and took advantage of his natural technical talents and added the life skills and independent living experience he needed. He bloomed under their guidance.

Justin graduated in 2020 with a certificate of completion in Technology. I got my first closeup of the Shepherds culture and mission at his graduation ceremony and saw that Justin was far from alone. As it turns out, Shepherds College has been a conduit for success for young people like Justin for a long time, the only one I've ever seen. Today, Justin is writing and producing radio plays, has a resume of successfully held jobs, and has a driver's license. Many folks would have said he would never have gotten this far, but he did, and now no one, including himself, doubts how far he can go.







This year in Technology was a delight as an instructor. All three classes showed significant growth. There were first-year students like James, who showed tremendous growth in focus and diligence over the year. David, a 2nd-year student, showed an intrinsic motivation to dedicate himself to improving daily. Finally, the entire 3rd-year class, Daniel, Austin, Lilly, Jonathan, and Peter, worked remotely for local technology companies most of the year and did fantastic jobs. Their ability to adapt and grow was amazing! Each student worked on a different project, from database assignments to internet research to Microsoft Excel spreadsheets.

One class member's growth was exceptionally notable, not because of quality, attitude, or speed but because of his emotional and professional advances over the school year. Austin started the year requiring reminders to stay



focused and on task. He needed help with motivation and initiative. Sometimes, he would get frustrated, and his team spirit would suffer. But, by the end of the school year, Austin found joy and satisfaction in his work. He stayed positive and focused on the tasks at hand.

By the second semester, Austin had improved so much that he was privileged to be selected to work for a brand-new Occupational Experience site, Ion Education (ion-k12.com). Ion Education works with school districts nationwide to track the progress of every student in each district. The company knows it's easy for school districts to notice which students are wildly successful and which are failing, but so often, some students perform just enough not to fail. Because these students aren't "problem kids," they fall through the cracks, and the schools aren't successful in educating them. Ion Education gives each student a "credit score," allowing school districts to quickly and easily assess which nonfailing students are overlooked or neglected. Austin and another student were assigned to work on the back-end of Ion Education's software to help in this process.

It was a joy to hear from Austin's supervisors about how well he was doing on the project. Austin stayed focused, working state by state through every school district in the country. The supervisors had to unexpectedly prep his work further in advance because he was getting through all the school districts in a state faster than expected!

Austin progressed so well in his technical abilities and interests that when he had downtime, he enjoyed learning about animation. He enjoyed it so much that he breezed through two entire Adobe Animate textbooks in one school year!

While all of our students grew tremendously this year in the Shepherds College® Technology Department, Austin's growth was unmatched. As instructors, we are not only proud of the growth in our students, but also thankful for the impact they are making in our community.

Bowling requires precision and resilience, two skills that can be easy for some students but difficult for others. It is remarkable to see students overcome challenges and grow in skill and confidence in this sport. One student, Maggie, overcame physical challenges and utilized accommodations to be an integral part of our bowling group. Maggie worked hard and desired to grow, so she ceased using a bowling ramp accommodation to work on strengthening her skills. Witnessing her challenging herself this way was extraordinary, and even more remarkable was that we did not see a decrease in her scores!

Basketball is our most popular sport, with nearly half the student body participating. Playing basketball requires teamwork, communication, and coordination. These skills are crucial on the court and in life. Through basketball, our students learn to work together and rely on each other. These relationships carry over into every part of the Shepherds College program. Basketball coach Jeremy Goedeke shared, "One thing I noticed was the growth of some student-leaders on my team. Two athletes were tentative to speak during games and practices, but with some encouragement, they demonstrated tremendous growth in leading by example and speaking up during drills, practices, and huddles."

We are kicking off our Soccer and Track & Field seasons at the time of this writing. Between these two sports, over half of our student body engages in weekly practices as they prepare for upcoming tournaments.

In Track & Field, our students have been working hard to develop their skills in running, jumping, and throwing events. These activities provide opportunities for students to showcase their individual abilities, which can sometimes be overlooked in team sports.

These athletic opportunities teach our students many lessons about teamwork, competition, communication, and perseverance. We are proud of our students and their accomplishments and look forward to seeing them continue to grow and thrive as they represent Shepherds College in Special Olympics competitions.


